Dear St. Thomas Family,

At this point, with just a bit of Lent and Holy Week before us, Easter is a steady beacon of light ahead. But first, we will spend some time together over the next week or so in the shadow of the cross. Palm Sunday and the liturgies of Holy Week are the most intense worship experiences of our Christian tradition, and they offer us a chance to deeply consider our Christian faith. Jesus, who is the deepest expression of God's love for humanity, offered his life to bring us the peace that only communion with God can give.

I think of Palm Sunday as the condensed form of Holy Week. We read enough of the Passion Narrative to understand and remember the "shape" of the story—the triumphant entry into Jerusalem, the Last Supper shared by Jesus with his disciples, his arrest afterward, his trial before the authorities, including Pontius Pilate, and finally his crucifixion.

In the week leading from Palm Sunday toward Easter, Holy Week, we will slow things down a bit. On Thursday, we gather to remember the night of Jesus's arrest, when he gathered with friends and shared bread and wine with them in a meal we remember and reenact each time we gather for the Eucharist. On Friday we focus on the day of Jesus's crucifixion in a stark and distinctive worship service that always brings me to barren state of spirit that I realize will pass only with the continuation of the vigil of the three days leading to Easter joy.

In this state of solemnity we gather for the Easter Vigil, in the descent of darkness on Saturday evening, we light the New Fire. In its light, we recount the stories of the Old Testament in which God came to the aid of his people with mighty acts and words of comfort and hope. And finally, when the vigil is ended, we banish the darkness from our sanctuary and greet the resurrected Christ with our shouts of "alleluia!" Although this worship service is the most distinctive and moving of the church year, we also gather on Sunday morning in broad daylight to celebrate Easter morning and the new life it brings.

In many ways the Holy Spirit has been moving us toward this Easter through all the turmoil that besets our world. The Church that was birthed by the experience of Jesus's resurrection is still a powerful witness to the abiding presence of God and the power of life over death, of love over hatred, and hope over despair. We are the messengers of God's grace shown in our ongoing proclamation of the life and ministry of Christ. I pray that your heart may be opened to show forth the power of God to make all things whole again and to bring the peace that the world cannot on its own achieve.
